Registration of the computing professionals and computing fellows will start as soon as possible.

The Director A&A HEC informed that attestation of degrees of Doctors and Engineers by HEC is subject to presentation of registration certificate/card issued by their respective professional council (PMDC or PEC). He advised that NCEAC could start the same practice.

- Institutes must publish information about their Faculty on their website (Name, Designation, Degrees, Year of award of degree, Picture, email address, etc.).
- Faculty member will be treated as full time if he / she is teaching at-least THREE courses in a year, to students of the degree program under evaluation. If a faculty member has administrative responsibilities (such as HoD, Dean etc.), then he / she will be counted as full time even teaches only one course in a semester.

Registration Policy for the Computing Graduates of Accredited Programs

National Computing Education Accreditation Council (NCEAC), Higher Education Commission (HEC), Pakistan

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Preamble

National Computing Education Accreditation Council (NCEAC) was established in 2004 to promote Computing education in the country. It was the first council to be established by HEC for accreditation of academic programs. The Council has made substantial progress since then. So far nearly 400 computing related programs in the country have been accredited and/or reaccredited by the Council. The Council is now moving forward to develop a database of all computing professionals and graduates of Pakistan. For this, the Council has developed membership policy for computing professionals and students.

1.0 Definitions

a) "HEC" means 'Higher Education Commission of Pakistan'

- b) "NCEAC" means 'National Computing Education Accreditation Council'
- c) "the Council" means 'National Computing Education Accreditation Council'
- d) "Accredited Program" means a 'computing program accredited by NCEAC'
- e) "University" means an HEC recognized University
- f) "Institute" means an HEC recognized degree awarding Institute
- g) "Computing Graduate" means an individual holding a 16 years equivalent degree in any of the Computing disciplines, from a university/institute recognized by HEC
- h) "CG" means 'Computing Graduate'
- i) "CP" means 'Computing Professional'
- j) "PCE" means 'Professional Competence Examination'
- k) "PFC" means 'Professional Fellow of Computing'

2.0 Introduction to NCEAC:

Higher Education Commission (HEC) was constituted on 11th September, 2002 through Ordinance F. No. 2(1)/2002.Pub. It was authorized under article 10 Sub-Section (e) to set up national or regional evaluation councils or authorize any existing council or similar body to carry out accreditation of Institutions including their departments, faculties and disciplines by giving them appropriate ratings. The Commission shall help build capacity of existing councils or bodies in order to enhance the reliability of the evaluation carried out by them.

Realizing the need for accreditation councils, the National Curriculum Revision Committee of Computer Science-2003, met in December 2003 and March 2004, recommended establishment of National Computing Education Accreditation Council for accreditation of degrees in Computing in Pakistan.

NCEAC was established with a mandate given by HEC to accredit Computing degree programs, offered by a university or institute in Pakistan. It ensures the quality of education received by students. It encourages maintenance and improvement of delivering quality education in computing. NCEAC serves the public through the promotion and advancement of education.

2.1 Objectives of NCEAC:

- To ensure quality in computing degree programs offered by educational institutions. It requires universities offering computing programs to meet standards and criteria laid down by NCEAC.
- Accreditation by NCEAC is mandatory for all computing programs, offered by public as well as private sector universities.
- Fostering intellectual development of students interested in pursuing computing profession.

3.0 Type of Registration

The Council shall register computing professionals in Pakistan, under the following categories of membership.

- 1. Student Member (SM)
- 2. Computing Graduate (CG)
- 3. Computing Professional (CP)
- 4. Computing Fellow (CF)
- 5. Computing Associate (CA)

3.1 Student Member

A student enrolled in an accredited computing program is eligible to register as **Student Member**.

3.2 Computing Graduate

Computing Graduate (CG) should have graduated from an accredited computing program from Pakistan, or from an HEC recognized foreign university

3.3 Computing Professional

A Computing Professional (CP) must satisfy any of the following conditions:

- a) Earned five (5) years of relevant computing experience, after completing 16 years of education from an **accredited** program
- b) Earned seven (7) years of relevant computing experience, after completing 16 years of education from a **non-accredited** program
- c) Earned five (5) years of relevant computing experience and must have passed 'Professional Competence Exam' conducted by NCEAC

3.3.1 Professional Competence Exam

NCEAC will arrange a Professional Competence Exam (PCE) as per schedule available on its website, for computing graduates from unaccredited programs.

3.4 Computing Fellow (CF)

Fellowship is awarded by the Council to individuals who have demonstrated significant contribution to the field of Computing or/and sustained achievement in their profession. Nominations and applications for the award of CF shall base on the following criteria:

a) Applicant should demonstrate his/her contribution to the field of Computing as a professional, and/or as an entrepreneur, or as an educationist, irrespective of the

applicant's field at the time of graduation. The council will assess the academic/ professional achievements of the applicant while deciding for this category.

b) That the individual has remained a RCP for a minimum period of ten years and have demonstrated excellence in his profession.

3.5 Computing Associate (CA)

Computing professionals who do not possess graduate qualification in Computing but are contributing to the field of computing as computer operators or as computing associates in the computing industry or the field of computing are eligible to apply for registration as Registered Computing Associates (RCA). They are required to furnish necessary proof to support their application.

4.0 Membership Fee

Registration fee for different categories is stated below:




6.0 Design and Format of the Registration card:

Background

General Council Decision

"NCEAC service structure was discussed in NCEAC 29th General Council meeting and a committee, comprising the following two members was constituted by the Council.

1. Dr Shoab A Khan

2. Dr Zartash Afzal Uzmi

Committee should present their recommendations in the next Council meeting for approval."

Working

Dr Shoab A Khan and Dr Zartash Afzal Uzmi discussed the service structure of the current employees of NCEAC. After some deliberation it was found that there already exist multiple models being practices in Higher Education Commission. Committee discussed all the existing models for the suitability for the computing council.

The following three models are considered in the order of priority for approval.

Model 1:

HEC Contract Employees under funded projects by Public Sector Development Program (PSDP)

This model was developed by Govt. of Pakistan for contract project employees working in the government sector and it was notified by Ministry of Finance.

In this model Basic Pay Scales (BPS) are equated with Project Pay Scales (PPS) and mentioned their salaries and increments accordingly. This model of GoP is implemented on project employees who are directly recruited from open market on contract basis, there it best suits the council to treat its employees as this type of contract workers.

This model equates different pay packages with regular BPS scale. Based on this equivalence, we suggest the following:

- 1. Mr Muhammad Jawad Hussain Bukhari on PPS-8 that is equivalent to BPS-18 with a salary of PKR 125,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.
- 2. Ms Sumaira Hafeez on PPS-7 that is equivalent to BPS-17 with a salary of PKR 90,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.
- 3. Mr Arslan Antique on PPS-7 that is equivalent to BPS-17 with a salary of PKR 90,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.

- 4. Mr Adnan Mansha on PPS-7 that is equivalent to BPS-17 with a salary of PKR 90,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.
- 5. Ms Mahnoor Fatima on PPS-7 that is equivalent to BPS-17 with a salary of PKR 90,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.
- 6. Mr Adeel Aftab on PPS-6 that is equivalent to BPS-16 with a salary of PKR 60,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.
- 7. Mr Syed Usama Ali on PPS-6 that is equivalent to BPS-16 with a salary of PKR 60,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.
- 8. Mr Muhammad Tanveer on PPS-2 that is equivalent to BPS-5 with a salary of PKR 20,000 with eligible for annual increment of 5% minimum.

All the terms and conditions will be the same as set by HEC for these employees. (Attached Annex- D-1)

Model 2:

Government of Pakistan Basic Pay Scale

This model is developed for GoP employees who are hired according to the rules of GoP and implemented in all government of Pakistan departments.

A draft recruitment rules and salary according to the rules of GoP was designed with the help of HR and finance department of HEC and it is attached as Annex – D-2

Model 3:

Existing Contract Employees Hired by Different Councils

The team has also considered the practice being followed by different councils operating under HEC. These councils have varying pay scales and percentage annual increments.

The best council to follow is the Business Council. The council pays PKR 190,000 to the program director (Equivalent to BPS 18). The program manager (Equivalent to BPS 17) in the council is payed PKR 145,000.

Similarly NTC also pays around PKR 150,000 (Secretary) to PKR 25,000 (Naib Qasid).

These councils also apply all existing HEC financial privileges to their employees, like three bonuses every year.

Recommendations

The committee after thorough deliberation **recommends** "**Model 1**" with all existing HEC financial privileges to their employees like bonuses for adoption by NCEAC. Committee also recommends the following.

- 1. **Increment:** Increment in standard pay package shall be admissible on completion of one year continuous service from the date of adaptation of this policy on the relevant post and also in the subsequent years in the same manner. The increment will be @ 5% minimum.
- 2. **Promotion Policy:** Promotion policy may be adopted as per Government of Pakistan service rules e.g.
 - i. Officer who is working scale 16 and fulfill the qualification requirements for the higher post may be considered for promotion in scale 17.
 - ii. Officers in scale 17 having 5 years continuous service and required qualifications may be considered for promotion in scale 18.
 - iii. Officers in scale 18 having 12 years continuous service in scale 17 and above or 7 years continuous service in scale 18 and required qualifications may be considered for promotion in scale 19.
 - iv. Officers in scale 19 having 17 years continuous service in scale 17 and above or 5 years continuous service in scale 19 and required qualifications may be considered for promotion in scale 20.
- 3. **Others:** Adopts all HEC financial rules which applies on the contract employees of the HEC like bonuses etc.

4. Leaves (as approved by the General Council in its 27th meeting):

- i. Staff shall be entitled to 12 (Twelve) days of casual leaves in each calendar year
- ii. Staff shall be entitled to 12 (Twelve) days of medical leaves in each calendar year
- Staff shall be entitled to 15 (Fifteen) days of earned leaves upon completion of each year of service. Earned leaves can be accumulated for a maximum of 45 days.
 Earned leaves will not be granted for less than seven days (one week).

5. Gratuity (as approved by the General Council in its 27th meeting):

- i. Staff shall be entitled gratuity upon leaving NCEAC, which shall be equal to one month's salary for each completed year of service. For the purpose of working out the gratuity, monthly salary shall be the average of salary paid for the most recently completed twelve months. Gratuity become payable at the time of separation from services which could be:
- ii. By resignation of the employee
- iii. Termination of services by employer due any reason other than misconduct (in case of proved misconduct employer is not bound to pay gratuity.)
- iv. In case of death, and
- v. Retirement or superannuation of employee
- vi. Gratuity shall be paid upon clearance of all matters with NCEAC.
